As soon as you have decided on your goals, you will need to arrange an appointment to meet with the Principal to discuss them. Please present your proposed challenges on a task sheet. Your challenges must be approved by the Principal before you commence. You must present at least one possible challenge for each category. It may be necessary to complete more than one task, if some of your challenges are easily achieved. The award should take the year to complete, so please consider this when putting together your goals. This is to be discussed and decided upon in conjunction with the Principal during your meeting.

Once your goals have been set, it is up to you to complete each challenge, and document your journey to achieving it, and present a presentation of your achievements by the end date - due Friday 1st November 2019. Remember: It is quality not quantity that counts, so take your time to do each challenge with excellence!
